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New Projects To Advance NERM and NDC Targets



"The Government of Vanuatu is committed to creating an enabling environment for renewable energy development.

"We are putting in place the policies, regulations, and incentives needed to attract investment, promote innovation, and accelerate the transition to a clean energy future," the Honourable Minister of Climate Change said.

Honourable Ralph Regenvanu, Minister of Climate Change, also responsible for Energy, was on Pentecost Island on May 6, 2025 to launch, through groundbreaking, of the Pico Hydro Projects for Melsisi and Waterfall, accompanied by Acting Director General and Director of the Department of Energy, Antony Garae. The third site for in-

stallation of a Pico Hydro Project is at Larimaat, also on Pentecost.

Also included in the delegation during the launch ceremony were; the Ambassador of Japan, His Excellency Naohisa Okuda and United Nations
Development Programme Team Leader for Resilience and Climate Change, Ms Merewalesi Laveti including dignitaries as well as stakeholders and members of parliament of Pentecost.

Vanuatu currently has a strategic framework called the National Energy Road Map (NERM), that is being implemented, which outlines the government's vision for the energy sector, aiming to achieve accessible, efficient, affordable, secure, sustainable,

and enabling environment for renewable energy development.

The Vanuatu Green Transformation
Project (VGET) was launched by the
Government of Vanuatu and the United
Nations Development Programme
(UNDP), in response to the challenge of
enhancing human security through green
transformation to address existing
challenges This project has been welcomed by the Government of Vanuatu
with appreciation for funding from the
Government of Japan, as this project will
advance renewable energy, energy efficiency and energy access for the most
vulnerable in Vanuatu communities.

This effort will also assist Vanuatu to achieve targets under the National Determined Contributions (NDC).

As Vanuatu enters 2025, Efate and Port Vila in particular, was and is still recovering from the earthquake that tragically claimed lives and damaged quite a number of buildings in Vanuatu's Capital..

The Ministry of Climate Change, through the National Disaster Management

Office and Vanuatu Meteorology and Geo-Hazards Department and stakeholder Departments such as the Department of Geology and Mines ensured a coordinated immediate response that included first responders such as Police and Pro Rescue.

The collaboration in the aftermath of the earthquake has seen this Ministry still contributing to operations as it goes into Recovery stage with lead agencies.

The Department of Environmental Protection and Conservation, through its Compliance team, has been actively involved in the demolition operation, where landmark buildings in Port Vila are reduced to rubbles following the damage caused to them by earthquake.

Apart from this tragic event, with aftershocks continuing and the ministry's activities being implemented as planned, I wish to acknowledge the work done by this Ministry's Early Warning Centre, and the National Emergency Operations Centre; who


despite damage equipment, ensured operations continue. At this juncture, I wish to acknowledge that the Annual Report for 2024 of the Ministry of Climate Change has been tabled, through the office of the Honourable Minister of Climate Change and endorsed by parliament.

I also wish to note that major projects in the energy sector are in progress to be completed this year such as the five mini solar grids in South and South East Malekula and the three pico hydro projects on Pentecost. These projects will not only ensure communities on these islands have access to clean, accessible and efficient renewable energy, but these will also move Vanuatu closer to achieving its targets under the National Energy Roadmap (NERM) and the National Determined Contribution.

UNFCCC Negotiations Training



A three-day United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) Negotiations Training started on May 13, 2025 at the Warwick Le their full capacity within science and Lagon in Port Vila.

When officially launching the Negotiations Training, Acting Director of Climate Change, Mr Nelson Kalo, who was speaking on behalf of the Director General, said the training is not only a capacity building exercise, but also a strategic moment to shape Vanuatu's voice and vision at COP30.

The Negotiations Training has been made possible through the Strengthening Pacific Leadership in International Climate Change Engagement (SPLICE) project, that brought Mr Ewan Cameron and Mrs Teuila Fruean from the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP) to facilitate the training.

"Vanuatu signed on to the Paris Agreement in 2015 with the expectation that all nations would mobilise technology to financially meet the 1.5°C goal.

"As we prepare to update our Nationally Determined Contributions in line with the outcomes of the Global Stocktake, we reaffirm our commitment to that vision," Acting Director Kalo said.

The training included a mock COP negotiations between "countries" that are signatory to the Paris Agreement and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

This year COP30 will be hosted in Belem, Brazil.

The training was officially closed by Director General, David Gibson.

Senior M&E Officer Attends Training in Nepal





The Ministry of Climate Change Adaptation's (MoCCA) Senior Monitoring and Evaluation (Senior M&E) Officer, Winy Marango, attended a two-day Asia Pacific Regional Training Workshop on Climate Change Negotiations from February 10 to 11 at Kathmandu, Nepal.

The MoCCA's Senior M&E's participation at the training was funded by the Government of the United Kingdom.

This training consisted of eight sessions.

The first session was on the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) negotiations and the Paris Agreement.

The second session covered the legal aspects and governance in terms of climate change negotiations, covering

key topics such as

Legal Structure of the Three Treaties:

- 1. Paris Agreement (2015)
- 2. Kyoto Protocol (1997)
- 3. UNFCCC (1992)

Third session was on scaling up mitigation ambition and the Global Stocktake, which focused on the latest climate science, exploring the sources of carbon emissions, the global response to reducing emissions, the global stocktake, and the role of mitigation in negotiations. Session 4 covered adaptation and the global goal on adaptation with the focus on the concept of adaptation, defined as "coping with climate change—taking measures to reduce its

negative effects or explore positive ones by making appropriate adjustments.

The fifth and sixth sessions saw participants taking part a mock negotiation, which provided participants with a hands-on opportunity to practice and experience climate negotiations.

The second last session was on Climate Finance, which explored the concept of climate finance. The 8th session went through practical tips on the UN Climate Change Conference and UNFCCC code of conduct, which provided an overview of what to expect during the UNFCCC COP, including a deeper understanding of the process, decision-making mechanisms, and the roles of different countries in the negotiating blocks.
